7. Numerical Features of Exodus 33

The common theme of the 'angel of YHWH', who will journey with the Israelites to the promised land, links Exodus 33 (cf. 1-3) to Exodus 23 (20-33) and also to Exodus 14 (19-20). Significantly enough, the number 47 appears no less than six times in 14, 20, 24, and 33:

14:2-4	YHWH reveals his plan to Moses	47 words
14:15-18	YHWH tells Moses what to do to execute his plan	47 words

All six passages have to do with Moses as YHWH's agent, whose mission is to execute YHWH's salvific acts. This mysterious number can be explained as representing the numerical value of the word מֵלְאָׁכִי (my angel' (13+12+1+11+10), which occurs explicitly in Exod. 23:23 (cf. also 32:34).

Conclusion: The idea of YHWH's Presence (Face) through his Glory (kabod) and his Name (YHWH), which is embodied in Moses, is skilfully interwoven into the text by means of the two divine name numbers. At the same time, the numbers **17** and **26** represent the numerical value of the word kabod (vs. 18 and 22), which is intentionally written in scriptio defectiva. Positional value: kbd = 11 + 2 + 4 = 17; decimal value: kbd = 20 + 2 + 4 = 26.

¹ The angel in Num. 20:16 has a different role: he brings the Israelites out of Egypt. The angel in Mal. 3:1 ('my angel') is to prepare the way for God. Note that God's speech in Mal. 3:19-21 (4:1-3) has **47** words! See also note 2 in my analysis of Exodus 23 for the **47** letters in Exod. 23:21!

In scriptio plena the word is written kbwd = 11 + 2 + 6 + 4 = 23 and 20 + 2 + 6 + 4 = 32. Consult the General Introduction, "The name YHWH woven into the fabric of the text", pp. 4-6.
